

Parking

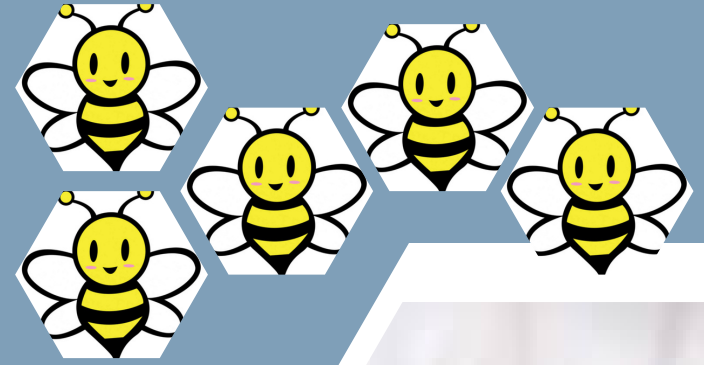

Be you

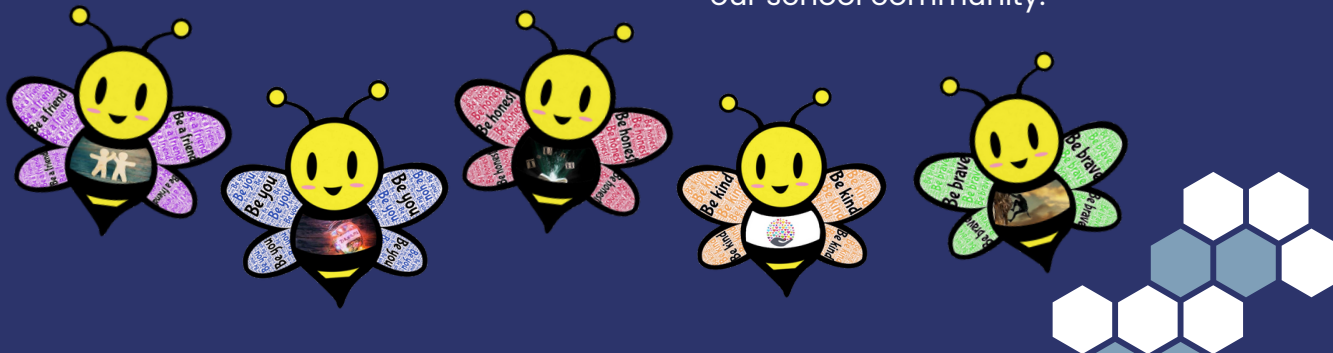
We will be the best version of ourselves and we celebrate everyone's differences.

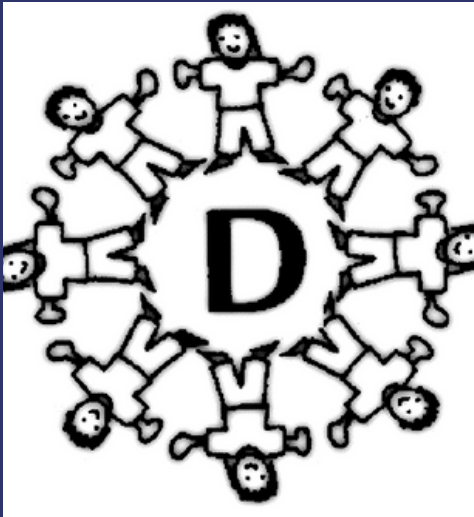

Welcome to Dalestorth Primary and Nursery School

On arrival at our school, you will be asked to provide visitor ID and DBS details.

If you can provide DBS information, you will be given a green lanyard to wear, with your visitor pass.

If you cannot provide these details, you will need to be accompanied by a member of staff throughout your visit, as indicated by a red lanyard.

Please do not be offended by this procedure, as it is part of our safeguarding policy.

Our staff all wear blue lanyards.

Governors and students who have been DBS checked will wear a black lanyard.
